SCHEDULE

STATUTE TO ALTER THE STATUTES OF GONVILLE AND CAIUS COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE, DULY MADE AT A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY CONSTITUTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH PROVISIONS OF THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923 AND HELD ON 24TH APRIL 2015 AMENDED STATUTE 10 WERE MADE IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED BY STATUTE 15 AS FOLLOWS:

Statute 10 which previously said

“Class C. Fellowships hereinafter called "Professorial Fellowships" the tenure of which is restricted to those who hold such Professorship or other Office in the University as is recognized by the Statutes of the University as qualifying the holder for election into this class of Fellowship and enumerated or referred to in Statute 15.”

was amended to read

“ Class C. Fellowships hereinafter called "Professorial Fellowships" held by Fellows on 30 September 2016 in virtue of such Professorship or other office in the University as was recognised by the Statutes of the University on or before the date as qualifying the officer to hold a Fellowship of this class. ”

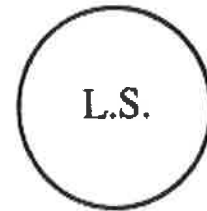
The Council of the University had previously indicated by notice dated 7th May 2015 that these changes were of no concern to the University.

SCHEDULE

STATUTE TO ALTER THE STATUTES OF WADHAM COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD, WHICH AMENDED STATUTE HAVING BEEN DULY MADE AT A MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE SAID COLLEGE, SPECIALLY SUMMONED FOR THE PURPOSE, AND HELD ON THE NINETH DAY OF JUNE 2015 AND PASSED AT THAT MEETING BY THE VOTES OF MORE THAN TWO THIRDS OF THE NUMBER OF PERSONS PRESENT AND VOTING, AND GIVEN TO THE UNIVERSITY, IS NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HER MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

We, the Warden Fellows and Scholars of Wadham College in the University of Oxford of the Foundation of Nicholas Wadham Esquire and Dorothy his wife, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under the Act in relation to our said College as follows:

Statute X1

A new clause should be inserted to allow for Borrowings.

Borrowing Power

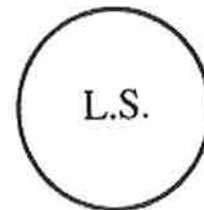
16. "By the same name they shall have full power and capacity to accept, acquire, and hold any personal property whatsoever including land houses and buildings; and they shall have full power to dispense of either by way of sale or lease, to exchange, mortgage, charge, improve, manage, develop, turn to account, or otherwise deal with all or any part of such property, real or personal, belonging to the College, upon such terms and such manner as they shall see fit; to borrow and raise money in any manner and to secure the repayment of any money borrowed, raised or owing by mortgage, charge, standard security, lien or other security upon the whole or any part of the College's property or assets (whether present or future); and also to do all other matters incidental or appertaining to a Body Corporate."

“That, in pursuance of their Resolution of 8th April 2015, the States of Deliberation at a meeting on 26th January 2016 approved a Projet de Loi entitled the Social Insurance (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 2016 and requested the Bailiff to present a most humble Petition to Your Majesty in Council praying for Your Royal Sanction to it.
