SCHEDULE

AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE UNIVERSITY
OF LIVERPOOL

1. **Delete** Article 1 and **substitute**:

“By this Charter there shall be constituted as a body corporate a University by the name of ‘The University of Liverpool’ with all the powers of a natural person to do all lawful acts whatsoever (‘the University’).”.

2. **Delete** Articles 2 to 30 and **substitute**:

“2 We, Our Heirs and Successors shall be and remain the Visitor and Visitors of the University of Liverpool through the Lord President of Our Council.

3 The objects of the University shall be to advance education, learning and research for the public benefit.

4 The University shall have power to grant and confer degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions, whether honorary, substantive, dual, joint or otherwise, and such degrees, diplomas, certificates and distinctions shall be granted, conferred and held subject to such provisions as may be made by the Ordinances of the University.

- 5 The University shall have power to co-operate by means of joint boards or otherwise with other universities, authorities and bodies whether public or private for any of the purposes of the University.
- 6 The University may admit to affiliation with it or to any of its privileges any educational establishment or institution or the members or students thereof upon such terms and conditions and subject to such regulations as may from time to time be prescribed by the Ordinances of the University.
- 7 The University shall consist of members who shall be prescribed by the Ordinances.
- 8 There shall be a Chancellor of the University who shall be ex-officio head of the University.
- 9 There shall normally be two Pro-Chancellors of the University. One of the Pro-Chancellors as prescribed by the Ordinances of the University shall act as Chancellor during a vacancy in that office or during the absence or inability of the Chancellor.
- 10 There shall be a Vice-Chancellor of the University who shall be the principal Academic and Administrative Officer of the University and ex-officio Chairman of the Senate.
- 11 There shall be one or more Deputy Vice-Chancellors and/or Pro-Vice-Chancellors of the University. Subject to the provisions of the Statutes and the Ordinances a Deputy Vice-Chancellor shall act as Vice-Chancellor during the temporary absence or inability of the Vice-Chancellor.
- 12 There shall be a Council of the University which, subject to the Statutes, shall be the governing body of the University responsible for the management and administration of the whole revenue and property of the University and the conduct of all the affairs of the University.
- 13 There shall be a Senate of the University which shall, subject to control by the Council as prescribed by the Statutes, oversee the teaching and research of the University.
- 14 There shall be such Faculties and other bodies as the Council may from time to time consider necessary to promote a comprehensive range of research, teaching and scholarship
- 15 There shall be a Guild of Students of the University. The constitution, functions, privileges and all other matters relating to the Guild of Students shall be prescribed and regulated as set out in the Ordinances.
- 16 The Statutes as defined in Clause 21 shall remain in force until altered or repealed. The Council may at any time add to, amend, alter or repeal the

Statutes by ordinary resolution provided that such Statutes shall not be effective until approved by the Privy Council. Any ordinary resolution means a resolution passed at a meeting of the Council by a majority of the members present and voting.

17 In everything done under this our Charter, and the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, the Council shall seek to avoid unlawful discrimination and promote equality of opportunity, dignity at work and study and good relations within the University.

18 The Council may make Ordinances and Regulations (except regulations governing courses of study and examinations which shall be made by the Senate) and may amend or repeal any Ordinances and Regulations so made. In matters relating to teaching and research, Ordinances shall be submitted to the Council on the recommendation of the Senate.”

3. **Renumber** Article 31 as 19.

4. **Delete** Articles 32 and 33 and **substitute**:

“20 The Council may at any time add to, amend or alter the provisions of this Charter by a special resolution and such addition, amendment or alteration shall only become effectual upon the approval of the Privy Council. A special resolution means a resolution passed at a meeting of the Council by not less than three-fourths of the members present and voting.

21 In this Our Charter, ‘Statutes’ means the Statutes of the University set out in the Schedule to this Our Charter and any Statutes adding to, amending, altering or repealing the same or any of them. ‘Ordinances’ means acts of the Council under the powers conferred by this Our Charter. ‘Regulations’, except when otherwise required by the context, means Regulations made pursuant to this Our Charter, the Statutes or the Ordinances.”.

SCHEDULE

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON

TUESDAY, 15 January 2013

WHEREAS it is expedient to change the existing provisions governing the Chung Kin Kwok Fund, NOW THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of Her Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS.

In Part 2 of Council Regulations 25 of 2002 concerning trusts, in §65 amend the title of the fund and regulations 1 and 3 as follows (new text underlined, deleted text scored through):

‘§ 65. **Chung ~~Kin-Kwok~~ Hon Dak Fund**

1. The University receives with gratitude the sum of £2,000,000 from The Chung Hon Dak Education Foundation Co. Limited (formerly known as The Chung Kin Kwok Education

Foundation Co. Limited) to be held on the trusts declared in this regulation. Further money or property may be paid or transferred to the University to be held on the same trusts. The assets so held will be known as the Chung ~~Kin Kwok~~ Hon Dak Fund ("the Fund").

3. The University shall apply the income of the Fund:

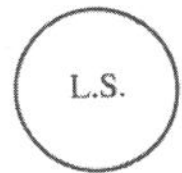
(1) in the period ending ten (10) years from the date of the trust instrument, supporting conservation of and providing digital access to the University's Chinese books, manuscripts and maps, in particular meeting the costs of providing the Ming dynasty Map of East Asia (the "Selden Map") for exhibition ~~in Shanghai~~; and

(2) thereafter, supporting the salary and expenses of the Chung ~~Kin Kwok~~ Hon Dak Chinese Studies Librarian (the "Post"). The Post holder shall be responsible for managing and promoting access to the Bodleian's Chinese collections for the purposes of educational study and research.

Any surplus income in any year shall, at the discretion of the University, be used in that year for the support of Chinese studies within the University's libraries or be placed on reserve for expenditure in the subsequent year as if it were income in that subsequent year.'

- 2) All Saints' Old Churchyard, East Hanningfield, Essex (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 3) St Giles' New Churchyard, Barrow, Shropshire (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 4) St James' Churchyard, West Tilbury, Thurrock, Essex (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 5) St John the Baptist's Churchyard, Stamford Bridge, East Riding of Yorkshire (as shown on the plan annexed hereto).

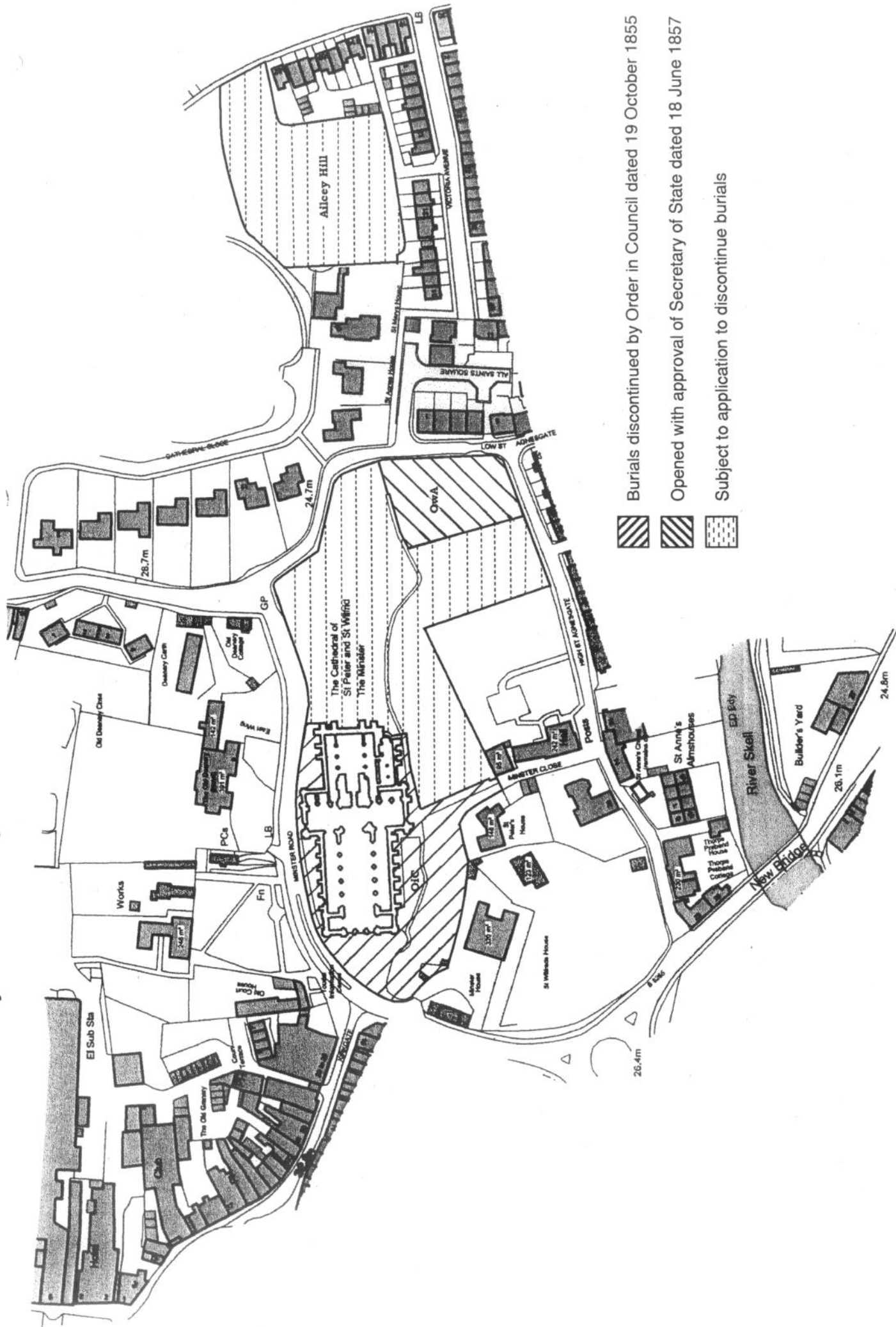
In pursuance of the Order in Council made on 15th May 2013 these representations have been published and taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council.




Accordingly, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that burials shall be discontinued forthwith in the places listed above, subject to the following exceptions:-

- a) in the places numbered 3, 4 and 5 above, in any existing earthen grave in the churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in that grave, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave;
- b) in the places numbered 4 and 5 above, in any vault or walled grave in the churchyard, burial may be allowed but every coffin in such vault or grave must be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and
- c) in the places numbered 4 and 5 above, in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or of any member of a family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

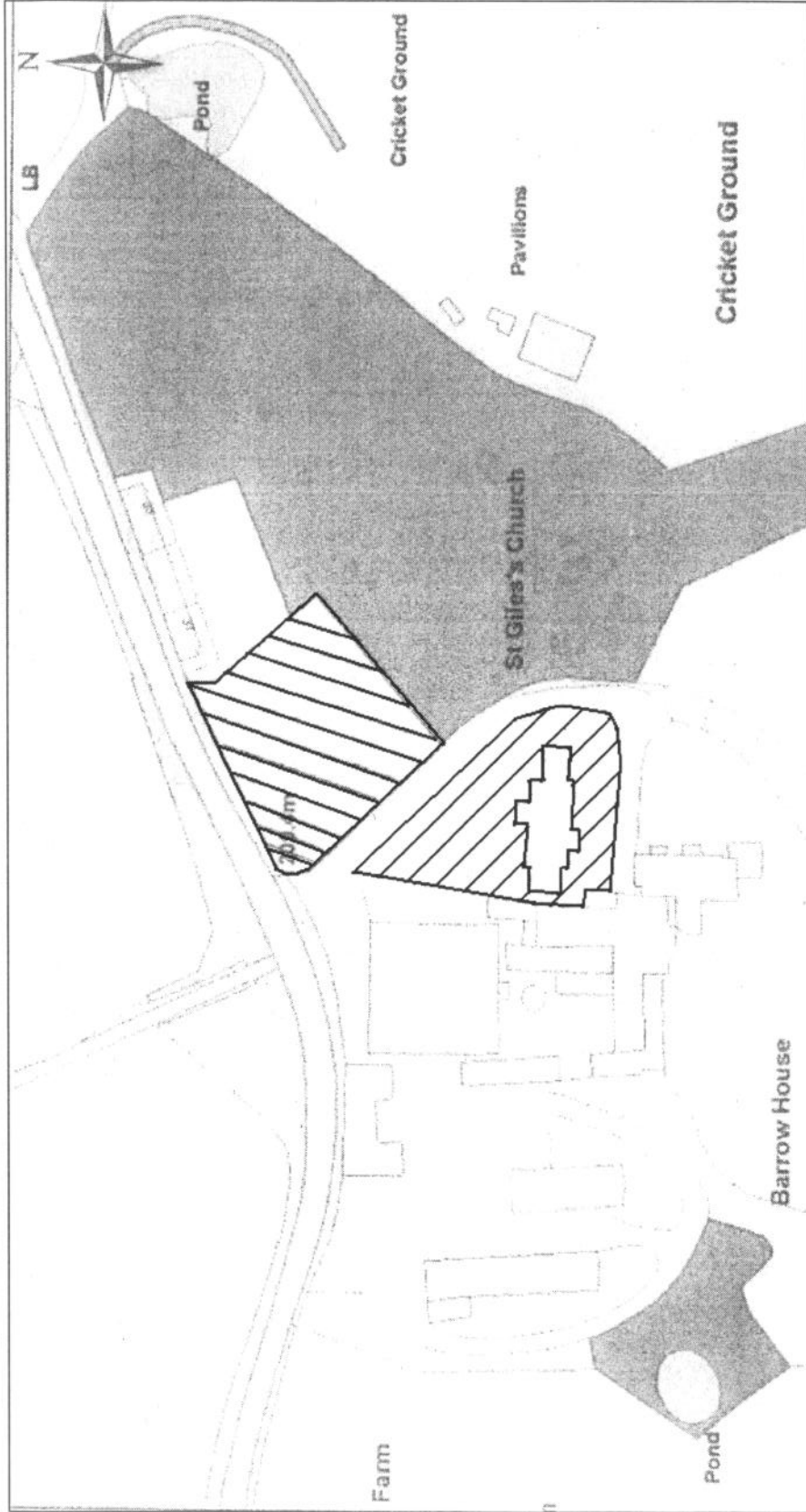

All Saints' Old Churchyard, East Hanningfield, Essex

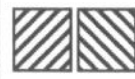


St Giles' New Churchyard, Barrow, Shropshire

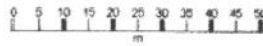
