The Public Appointments Order in Council 2002 ("the 2002 Order") makes provision for an independent Commissioner to monitor the procedures adopted by appointing authorities (Ministers of the Crown and others) when making appointments to public bodies.

It is desirable to revoke the 2002 Order (as amended) and make further provision in relation to these matters.

Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order as follows:-

Citation commencement and revocation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Public Appointments Order in Council 2013 and comes into force on the day after the day on which it is made.

(2) The Orders in Council listed in Schedule 1 are revoked.

(3) Paragraph (2) is of no effect in relation to functions of the Commissioner exercised under article 2 of the Public Appointments Order in Council 2002(a) before the coming into force of this Order.

Interpretation

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act 1978(b) applies for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if the Orders listed in Schedule 1 were enactments for the purposes of section 16(1) of that Act.

(2) In this Order:

"appointing authority" means, in relation to a public appointment—

- (i) a Minister of the Crown or, as the case may be, the Welsh Ministers, the First Minister for Wales or the Counsel General;
- (ii) the National Health Service Trust Development Authority where an appointment is made by it on behalf of a Minister of the Crown, or the Welsh Ministers, the First Minister for Wales or the Counsel General;
- (iii) in relation to the UK Commission for Employment and Skills, a Minister of the Crown or, as the case may be, the Scottish Ministers, the Northern Ireland Ministers or the Welsh Ministers, the First Minister for Wales or the Counsel General;

“audit” means the carrying out of any review by or on behalf of the Commissioner of the appointment procedures and practices followed by appointing authorities in making appointments;

“Commissioner” means the person appointed for the time being by Her Majesty in Council to be Her Majesty’s Commissioner for Public Appointments for the purposes of this Order;

“public appointment” means any appointment (including any re-appointment or extension of an appointment) made by, or on the recommendation of, an appointing authority to a public body or public office;

“public body” means any body that falls under Schedule 2;

“public office” means any office that falls under Schedule 2.

(3) Where a provisional appointment is to be made before a body or office exists in law or before a body or office has been specified as a public body or public office for the purposes of this Order, the Minister for the Cabinet Office may notify the Commissioner that the appointment is to be treated as if it were a public appointment to a public body or public office for the purposes of this Order.

Functions of the Commissioner

3.—(1) The Commissioner shall, in the manner the Commissioner considers best calculated to promote economy, efficiency, effectiveness, diversity and equality of opportunity in the procedures for making public appointments, exercise the Commissioner’s functions with the object of maintaining the principle of selection on merit in relation to public appointments.

(2) The Commissioner shall prescribe and publish a code of practice on the interpretation and application by appointing authorities of the principle of selection on merit for public appointments and shall adopt and publish from time to time such additional guidance to appointing authorities as the Commissioner shall think fit.

(3) The Commissioner shall audit public appointment policies and practices pursued by appointing authorities to establish whether the code of practice is being observed by appointing authorities.

(4) The Commissioner may require appointing authorities to publish such summary information as may be specified relating to selection for public appointment.

(5) The Commissioner may from time to time conduct an inquiry into the policies and practices followed by an appointing authority in relation to any public appointment or description of public appointment.

(6) The Commissioner may recruit and train public appointment assessors for the purpose of advising and assisting an appointing authority in relation to any public appointment.

(7) For the purposes of paragraphs (3) and (5), appointing authorities must provide the Commissioner with any information the Commissioner reasonably requires.

Additional functions

4.—(1) The Commissioner may, at the request of a Minister of the Crown, carry out such additional functions relating to appointments (whether public or otherwise) as may be agreed between the Minister and the Commissioner.

(2) Public appointment assessors recruited in accordance with article 3(6) may advise and assist in relation to appointments falling under paragraph (1) of this article.

Commissioner’s Annual Report

5. The Commissioner shall publish an annual report which shall include—

- (a) information as to the application by appointing authorities of the principle of selection on merit and as to the observance by such authorities of the code of practice, and
- (b) an account of the audit of public appointment procedures and practices.

Exercise of the Commissioner's powers and duties

6.—(1) Any power or duty of the Commissioner may be exercised by an officer of the Commissioner authorised for that purpose by the Commissioner.

(2) The Commissioner may from time to time, and to such extent as the Commissioner thinks fit, authorise any person to perform any function under article 3(3) or 4.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order replaces the Public Appointments Order in Council 2002. That Order was amended by the Public Appointments (Amendment) Order in Council 2008, the Public Appointments (Amendment No. 2) Order in Council 2008, the Public Appointments (Amendment) Order in Council 2009, the Public Appointments (Amendment No. 2) Order in Council 2009, and the Public Appointments (Amendment) Order in Council 2010 (“the 2010 Order”). It sets out the duties and powers of the Commissioner for Public Appointments (“the Commissioner”).

The principal provisions of the Order are:

Article 3, which sets out the functions of the Commissioner, and provides for the issue of a code of practice on the interpretation and application of the principle of selection on merit and for the audit of selection policies and practices. Article 3(7) requires appointing authorities to provide the Commissioner with information required by him in relation to an audit or an inquiry.

Article 4, which enables the Commissioner to undertake additional functions relating to appointments at the request of a Minister of the Crown.

Article 5, which requires the Commissioner to publish an annual report.

Article 6, which allows the delegation of any power of the Commissioner to any officer of the Commissioner. The Commissioner may also authorise any person to perform the functions of auditing selection practices and policies.

Schedule 1 gives details of the Orders revoked in accordance with article 1.

Schedule 2 lists the public bodies and public offices, appointments to which are public appointments for the purposes of the Order.

The following table shows the bodies that were listed in the Schedule to the 2010 Order, but which do not appear in Schedule 2 to this Order.

Representations were duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for Justice that, subject to the exceptions below, burials should be discontinued forthwith in:-

- 1) St Laurence's New Churchyard, Downton, Wiltshire (as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto);
- 2) St Michael's Churchyard, Longstanton, Cambridgeshire;
- 3) All Saints' Churchyard, Thornton Dale, Ryedale, North Yorkshire;
- 4) All Saints' Churchyard, Waldron, East Sussex (as shown on the plan annexed hereto).

In pursuance of the Order in Council made on 12th February 2013 these representations have been published and taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council.

Accordingly, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that burials shall be discontinued forthwith in the places listed above, subject to the following exceptions:-

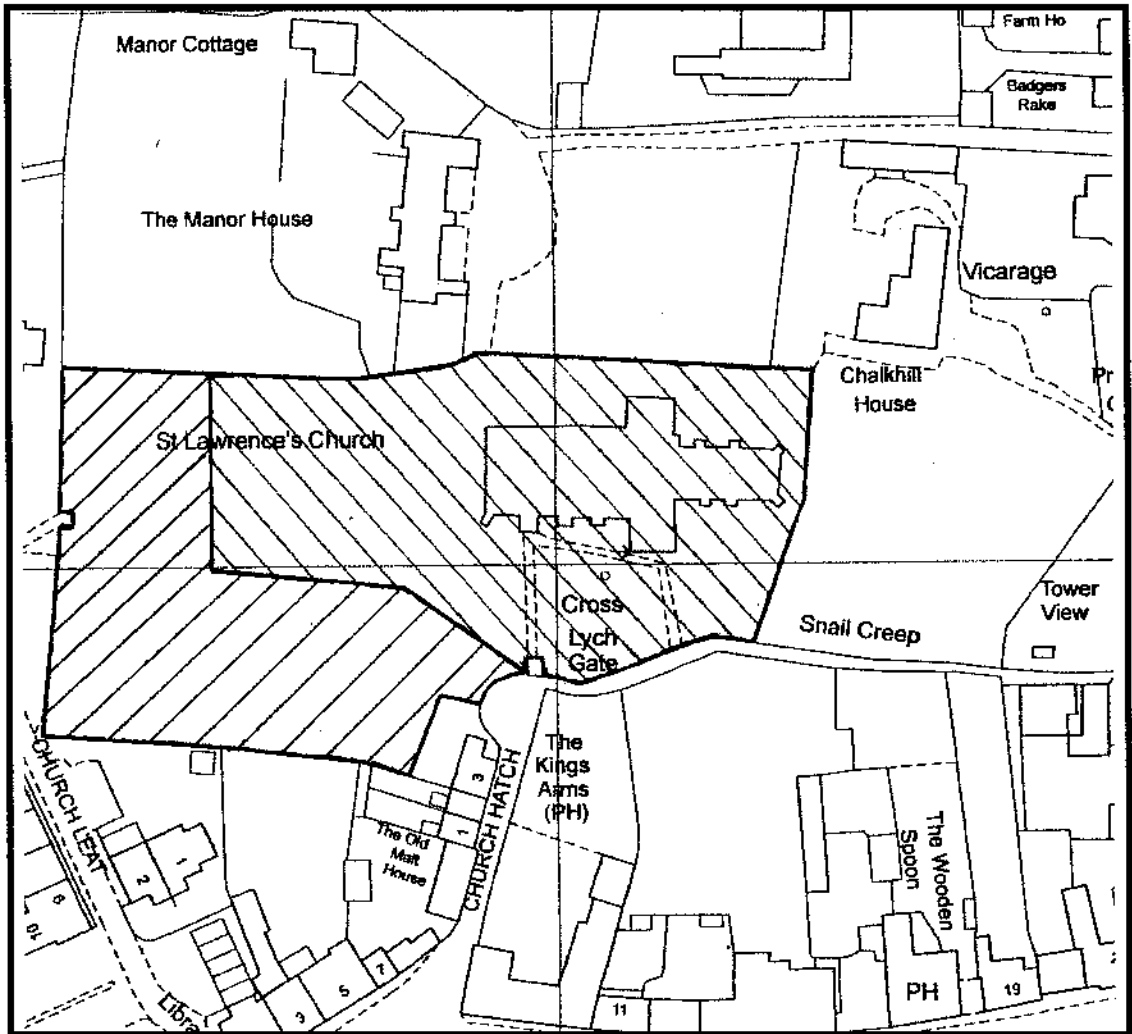
- (a) in the places numbered 1, 2, 3 and 4 above, in any existing earthen grave in the churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in that grave, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave;

- (b) in the place numbered 2 above, in any vault or walled grave in the churchyard, burial may be allowed but every coffin in such vault or grave must be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and

- (c) in the place numbered 2 above, in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or any member of the family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

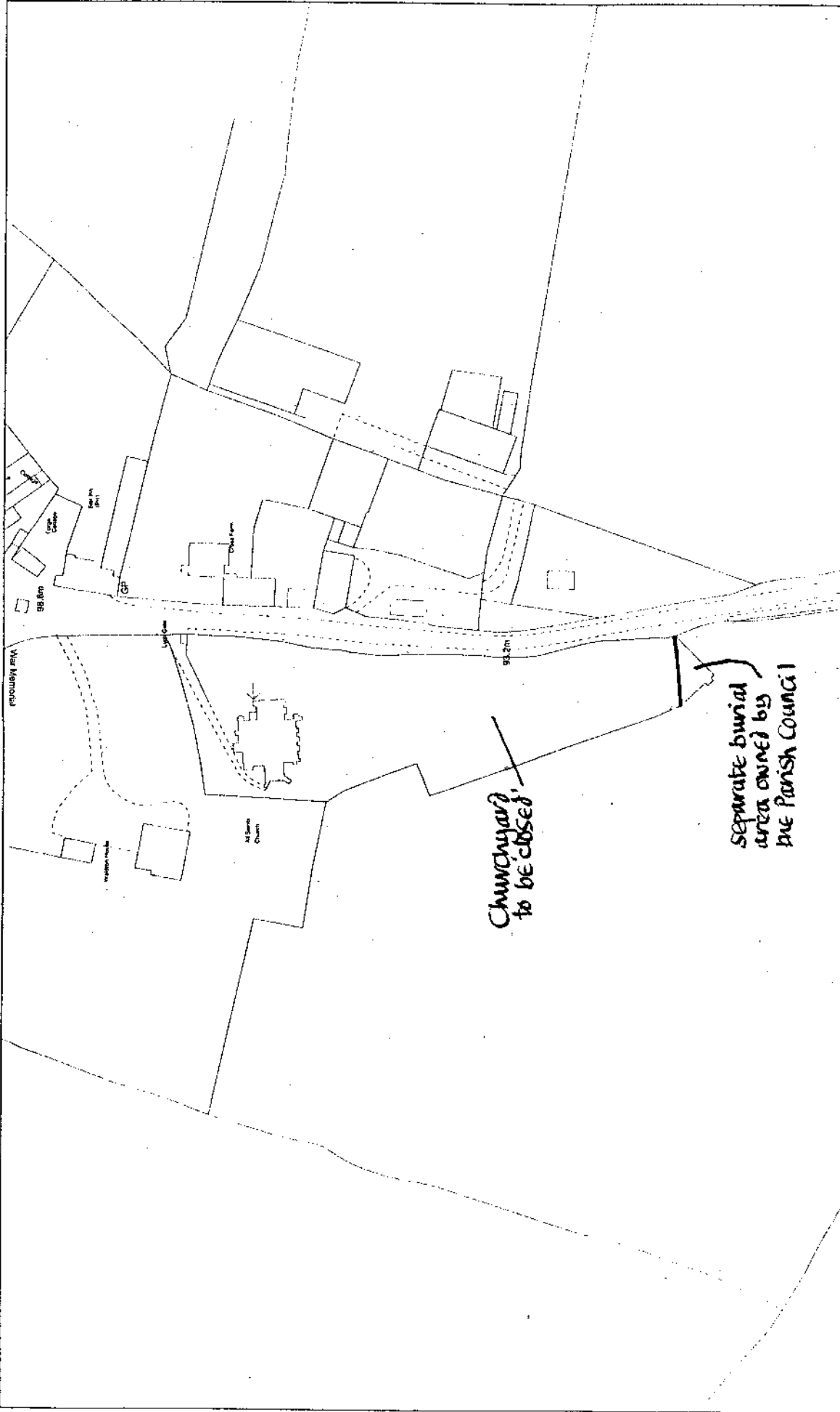
St Laurence's New Churchyard, Downton, Wiltshire
