AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE UNIVERSITY OF BRISTOL

- 1. In Articles 4 and 5 *delete* "Council" and *substitute* "Board of Trustees".
- 2. **Delete** Article 10 and **substitute**:

"10. The Board of Trustees

With effect from 1 January 2016, the name of the Governing Body of the University was changed from "Council" to "the Board of Trustees". After this date, all references in the Charter, Statutes, Ordinances and otherwise to "Council" shall be changed to, and shall be construed as, references to "the Board of Trustees".

Powers of the Board of Trustees

There shall be a Board of Trustees which shall be the Governing Body of the University and have power to direct the use of the University Seal and subject to the Statutes of the University shall have the government and control of the finances of the University and of the affairs and property of the University. The Board of Trustees shall submit a report to each annual meeting of the Court, including a report of changes to the Charter, Statutes and Ordinances.

The Trustees

Statutes of the University shall regulate the election and continuance in office of the Trustees the filling of vacancies among the Trustees and all other matters relative to the Board of Trustees which it may be thought are proper to be so regulated.

Statutes

The Board of Trustees may make Statutes and amend add to or repeal the Statutes for the time being but no such Statute and no such amendment addition or repeal shall be valid or operative until allowed by the Privy Council.

Ordinances

Ordinances may be made by the Board of Trustees for the regulation of all matters not required by this Our Charter to be dealt with by Statute.".

- 3. In Articles 11, 12, 14, 16, 17 and 19 wherever it appears *delete* "Council" and *substitute* "Board of Trustees".
- 4. In Article 23:
 - (a) before "may at any time alter" *delete* "Council" and *substitute* "Board of Trustees";
 - (b) after "Resolution passed at one meeting of the" *delete* "Council" and *substitute* "Board of Trustees";
 - (c) after "three-fourths of the" *delete* "members of the Council" and *substitute* "Trustees".
- 5. In Article 24, after ""Ordinances" means Acts of the" *delete* "Council" and *substitute* "Board of Trustees".

- (c) in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or any member of the family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the

body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Her Majesty in Council is pleased to give Notice of these representations and to order that they be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on 20th January 2016.







- b) in any existing earthen grave in the churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in that grave, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave; and
- c) in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or any member of the family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.


