*SCHEDULE*

AMENDMENTS TO THE BYE LAWS OF THE CHARTERED COLLEGE OF TEACHING

1. In Bye law 1 "Interpretation" at the end of the Table *insert* new line:  
"Present in person      Includes present by electronic means".
2. In Bye law 2(iv) *delete* "at an appropriate general meeting on the nomination of" and *substitute* "by".
3. In Bye law 14 *delete* "in general meeting".
4. *Delete* Bye laws 15 to 16 and *substitute*:  
"15 The Council shall consist of between twelve and twenty-seven voting members elected or appointed in the manner and for the terms of office set out in the Regulations and shall include:
  - (i) the Officers of the Council, whether elected, appointed, by succession, or a combination thereof;
  - (ii) other elected Council members; and
  - (iii) other Council members appointed by Council.
  - (iv) Registered Chartered Teachers shall be in the majority of members serving on the Council.

16 The Officers of the Council, whose duties and terms of office shall be as defined in the Regulations, shall consist of:

(i) The President, and may include:

(ii) The President-Elect

(iii) up to three Vice Presidents,

and

(iv) The Honorary Treasurer.

(v) Only members may be elected as Officers of the Council.”.

5. **Delete** Bye law 25.

6. **Renumber** Bye laws 26 to 30 as Bye laws 25 to 29.

7. In Bye law 26 as renumbered **delete** “election of Officers and Council and for”.

8. **Insert** new Bye law 30:

“30(i) Subject to the provisions of these Bye laws, Regulations may make provision for participation in meetings by electronic means.

(ii) Where any election or vote is to be taken at a general meeting, it may be taken by ballot or poll taking place at the time of the meeting, or by ballot of all those eligible to attend the general meeting in question, taking effect when the outcome of the ballot is announced to that general meeting.”.
