SCHEDULE

AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE INSTITUTION OF CHEMICAL ENGINEERS

1. In By-law 67:
 - (i) **delete** "The Honorary Officers shall be elected annually." and **substitute** "The Deputy President, President and Immediate Past President shall be elected annually.";
 - (ii) after "by the Nominations Committee." **insert** "The Honorary Treasurer shall be elected for an initial term of three years renewable for a further two terms of three years each.".
2. In By-law 68:
 - (i) **delete** "All the Honorary Officers" and **substitute** "The Deputy President, President and Immediate Past President";
 - (ii) **delete** "The Honorary Treasurer shall not be eligible for re-election if such re-election would involve their holding Office as such for more than six years.".
3. In By-law 72:
 - (i) after "nor less than one year." **insert** "Having regard to the need to create a pattern of rolling retirements in the interests of continuity, the Board of Trustees shall determine the terms prior to any election.".

- (ii) *delete* “Deputy President, President or as Immediate Past President” and *substitute* “Honorary Officers”.
4. In By-law 74 *delete* “having regard to the need to create a pattern of rolling retirements in the interests of continuity of the Board”.
5. In By-law 82 *delete* “scrutineers being unable to report” and *substitute* “independent report being unable to identify”.
6. *Delete* By-law 108 and *substitute*:
- “108. Any notice or communication served using electronic communications shall be deemed to have been served at the expiration of 48 hours after the time it was sent and proof that a notice contained in an electronic communication was sent shall be conclusive evidence that the notice was given. Any notice or communication served or sent by pre-paid post shall be deemed to have been served or delivered at the expiration of fourteen days after the date it was dispatched and in certifying such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the notice or packet containing it was properly addressed, pre-paid and delivered to the carrier.”.
